What is UP Road Tax?

UP road tax is a state-level tax levied by the Uttar Pradesh Transport Department on all motor vehicles registered in the state. This tax applies to private vehicles, commercial vehicles, two-wheelers, and transport vehicles.

- Cost of the vehicle
- Fuel type
- Usage (private or commercial)
